Minutes of the County Commissioners Regular meeting held on May 2, 2022

The Board of the Grady County Commissioners met on this day for an regularly scheduled meeting with the following board members: Ralph Beard, Kirk Painter, and Mike Walker.

The meeting was called to order and roll call: Ralph Beard, Kirk Painter, and Mike Walker

The meeting was opened with the "Pledge of Allegiance"

Kirk Painter made a motion to approve the minutes of the April 25, 2022 regular meeting. It was seconded by Ralph Beard. AYE: Ralph Beard, Kirk Painter, and Mike Walker.

Mary Parish along with other OHCE members were in attendance. Mary Parish updated the Board on the volunteer work and accomplishments they have done in the last year. This included education scholarships, quilts to veterans, raising money for the hungry, feeding service organizations, education to Grady County students, 4-H programs, planting trees, sponsoring a window at the Chickasha Public Library, and much more. Kirk Painter made a motion to approve the proclamation for OHCE (Oklahoma Home and Community Education) week for OSU Extension. It was seconded by Mike Walker. AYE: Ralph Beard, Kirk Painter, and Mike Walker.

Mike Walker made a motion to approve the plat map called Heritage Hills Phase 2 and the road would not be maintained by the County. It was seconded by Ralph Beard. AYE: Ralph Beard, Kirk Painter, and Mike Walker.

Ralph Beard read a text message from the District Attorney's Office stating that they did not feel the ARPA money should be used for Premium Pay for County Employees. Lynn Driver stated the Board needed to weigh the District Attorney's opinion, but that it is ultimately the Board of County Commissioner's decision and that it is a perfectly legal expenditure. She stated they worked with other counties and the State Auditor's office to ensure the legality. She also stated the District Attorney's Office must have a non-legal reason for opposing the expenditure. Ralph Beard asked Ms, Driver questions on how other counties decided the monetary amount for their employees. Ms. Driver replied that all the counties she worked with paid the employee's an X amount an hour for each hour they worked at the job site for a set time frame. Ralph Beard asked if different groups could be paid different amounts. Ms. Driver stated that you could, you would need to determine the qualification for this; however, she had not seen a County do it as of yet. Lisa Hannah stated that she was worried about disgruntled employees, she had single moms that had to take off for sick kids that could be negatively impacted because they couldn't come to work. Ms. Driver stated it would be possible to give a single rate to all employees, they would just have to figure how many hours everyone worked and ensure that everyone got paid for the same number of hours. Jim Weir stated that he felt his employee's deserved the premium pay as they worked the entire time in direct contact with the public. Ralph Beard stated that Charles Sifers A.D.A. would be at the meeting next week, and he would like D.A. Jason Hicks to attend as well to discuss their concerns with the Premium Pay. Lisa Hannah reiterated that she felt her employee's deserved the pay as well she is just concerned with all of her employee's being treated fairly. Kealee Romero asked Ms. Driver about how Hazard Pay would be deducted. Ms. Driver stated that she believed the hours that employees were paid Hazard Pay for would be deducted and not the total amount of the Hazard Pay. Kean Spellman asked if the ARPA Funds would be used to cover the employer side of FICA and Retirement so that it would not affect the county's budget. Ms. Driver stated that yes it would. Ms. Driver also said that the departments would need to turn in a copy of the signed

timesheets, a spreadsheet, and the signed affidavit into the County Clerk's Office, and then the County Clerk's Office could submit the entire county's information to them. Kirk Painter stated that we could go back and forth continuously on this, however he was for it. Kirk Painter made a motion to approve the ARPA request for Grady County Premium Pay Program for County Employees in the amount of \$4.00 per hour for the time frame of April 1st 2020 through April 30th 2021. It was seconded by Ralph Beard. AYE: Ralph Beard, Kirk Painter, and Mike Walker.

There was no action on the agenda item for American Rescue Plan Act Money.

GCEMA/Fire Report/Safety Director: Emergency Management was absent. Kim Duke reported that she had been off of work on Friday. She also stated that there is a Friend appreciation dinner today between 3:30 pm to 8 pm and that the Auction would start at 6 pm. Rodney Young was in attendance and asked if the Board had an opportunity to resolve the issue with the Fire Department not being able to get water from the town of Bradley. Commissioner Beard stated that he had been in touch with the State Auditors and they would be investigating this situation. If the Fire Department needed water again for a fire to get as the town could not refuse water in an emergency. He also stated that if any of the Firefighters were assaulted that he would press charges on their behalf for assaulting a Firefighter during an active emergency. Bobby Cantu reported that there were two reportable injuries in Grady County. Crystal Creek and himself came last Friday from 5pm to 1:30am to remove the tile, cleanup in Judge Lowes Office, removal of old insulation around two water pipelines, and removing old paint in four of the old jail cell blocks. He will be conducting the second quarterly safety meetings with District 1, District 3, Assessor's Office, and County Clerk's Office. He informed the Board that City Pavement was planning on coming May 7th to begin the parking lot; contingent on the weather.

Kim Duke stated she is still writing the job description for the new part time position. Kirk Painter stated that she needed to run the job opening in the paper for two weeks and post it on the website. He requested that the hiring of the part time employee be added to the May 16th Commissioners meeting agenda.

No draw request from Grady Memorial Hospital. Kean Spellman was in attendance, he stated that Covid rates were still down. He also asked the Board to let him know when the Health Department would be able to move into their new building, as they were needing space for their Pulmonologist and other Physicians.

Ralph Beard made a motion to approve of a change order for a bridge over Rush Creek near Cox City for Oklahoma Department of Transportation. It was seconded by Kirk Painter. AYE: Ralph Beard, Kirk Painter, and Mike Walker.

Ralph Beard made a motion to table the supplement agreement on the Ninnekah Road Project between Grady County District 3 and ODOT. It was seconded by Kirk Painter. AYE: Ralph Beard, Kirk Painter, and Mike Walker.

Ralph Beard made a motion to approve the utility/pipeline road crossing permits, waterline/fast-line permits, and driveway/tinhorn permits for District #1 & #3. It was seconded by Kirk Painter. AYE: Ralph Beard, Kirk Painter, and Mike Walker.

Ralph Beard made a motion to approve the purchase orders generated by the Grady County governing bodies during the current and previous months and authorize or deny payment of such

Audience Participation: Lynn Cobb was in attendance and stated he just wanted to come by and say hello. Bob Moore was also in attendance to say hello to the Board. The Harold Fire Chief was in attendance and asked about the progress of their latest ARPA request. He stated that he had 6 firefighter's that could not go out on calls as they were waiting on the ARPA request to buy them Wildland gear. Mike Walker stated that if he submitted the amount needed for the gear, he would get money moved to the Rural Fire Highway account to get the purchase, as it was too risky not having all of our firefighters available to respond to fires.

New Business: Kirk Painter stated that the Fire Board currently had two seats open, Farwell and Bradley representatives. He also stated that we recently had an issue with certified mail for a summons to the BOCC on a lawsuit filed against them to get taken to the wrong place. Because of this he wants to take down the drop boxes downstairs and have the mail delivered to each department as was policy pre-covid. He requested that this be added to the agenda next week.

Ralph Beard made a motion to adjourn. It was seconded by Kirk Painter. AYE: Ralph Beard, Kirk Painter, and Mike Walker.
